These dogs do not have any form of public access. They may or may not be capable of performing simple in-home helping tasks, this is determined on a case-by-case basis.

Emotional Support Dog



- In order to be eligible, applicants must complete the full application process, agree to all of the documents and policies therein; be approved by the application committee as a good candidate with proper support network in place to care for and fully utilize one of our Assistance Dogs, Facility Dogs, or Emotional Support Dogs.
- Applicants must agree to the terms of the applicable Private Placement Agreement and the Pay-It-Forward Policies.
- Applicants will be considered regardless of geographic location; but their ability to travel to the extent necessary for the paws4people training, placement, and recertification requirements will be taken into account.
- Applicants must be able to meet the physical and financial needs to care for a Dog per paws4people standards.
- All applications shall be processed in a timely and organized manner per our Application Review Policy.
- All applicants, Clients, Handlers, Alternative K9 Caretakers, and Secondary Handlers shall be treated with dignity and respect by all employees, volunteers, students, sponsors, donors, vendors, and fellow Clients Handlers, Alternative K9 Caretakers, and Secondary Handlers of the organization.
